

Our Lady of Lourdes Parish History

In 1957, the sector of Kingston Township served by Our Lady of Lourdes School became a mission of St. Mary's Cathedral, and the school became the social, liturgical, and educational centre of the local Catholic community. As the population of the area grew, the auditorium in the school became inadequate for Sunday Masses, and the construction of a new church became necessary. In 1966, parishioners of the mission elected a committee to purchase a site for the church, and Our Lady of Lourdes Parish was established at its present location in 1967. The Most Reverend Joseph Wilhelm, Archbishop of Kingston, appointed Rev. Robert Flurey as the first pastor. Plans for the new church were finalized in September of 1969, and construction commenced on the building at 490 Days Road, Kingston. Our Lady of Lourdes Parish Church was blessed and dedicated on November 1, 1970. A rectory was added in 1974, and a parish hall in 1992. Renovations made to the interior of the church in 1998 included a ceramic and terrazzo floor, a permanent baptismal font, and a large crucifix in the sanctuary. A Wall of Honour dedicated to Our Lady of Lourdes was constructed in the front vestibule of the church in 2012.



Wall of Honour

Our Lady of Lourdes Parish enjoys a rich tradition of faithful, generous, and hard-working parishioners. These individuals have been – and continue to be – the cornerstone of the parish, enabling it to flourish, and its buildings and grounds to be beautifully maintained.

In order to recognize the generosity of parishioners and to provide an ongoing and much-needed source of income for the long-term maintenance of the parish, a Wall of Honour has been constructed in the front vestibule of the church. This Wall was blessed and dedicated to Our Lady of Lourdes by the Most Reverend Brendan M. O'Brien, Archbishop of Kingston, on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, December 8, 2012. The Wall of Honour provides a peaceful and prayerful introduction to the church for both parishioners and visitors, and a tranquil setting for the lighting of vigil candles.

Donations of \$1000 or more towards the Our Lady of Lourdes Parish Capital Fundraising Campaign are recognized with a plaque on the Wall of Honour, indicating either the name of the donor or the name of a person designated by the donor. The Wall of Honour records for generations to come the generosity of the people who support the parish. Every year, on or near the Feast Day of Our Lady of Lourdes – that is, February 11th – a Mass is celebrated for the intentions of the donors.
